Our Summer Mission Trip

Nikiski United Methodist Church and Birchwood United Methodist Church Camp in Chugiak, Alaska, are in need of more than you can imagine. These are our neighbors and brothers and sisters in the Methodist church; and from July 2 to July 10, you will get the extraordinary opportunity to help! You can come by yourself or bring your whole family. You can pick your project or go with the flow.

This summer, our church will be taking a mission team to Nikiski and Chugiak, Alaska. Two project destinations in one trip. We will offer our service to the Nikiski UMC, where the parsonage has a great deal of updating to do with the plumbing and electrical. They also have some demolition and rebuilding of a concrete patio for the church building itself. Their outdoor play area for the local children is in need of much repair.

We will then get an opportunity to work at the Birchwood UMC Camp in Chugiak, where there are many options for service, the new construction of a Lodge Pole building, major yard work, trail maintenance, and camping ministry for children.

Cost: Just under \$1,000.00 per person, this includes transportation from Seattle to Anchorage, food, lodging, supplies and conference insurance.

Keep Our Wednesday Kids' Class Alive!

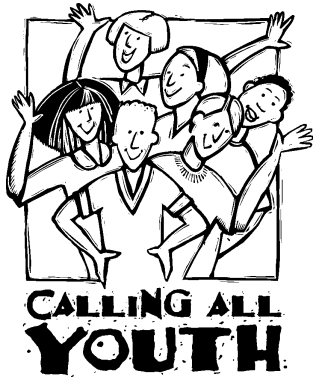
With more and more families involved in our Wednesday evening ministries, offering a class for elementary children to participate in during that time is even more important than ever before!

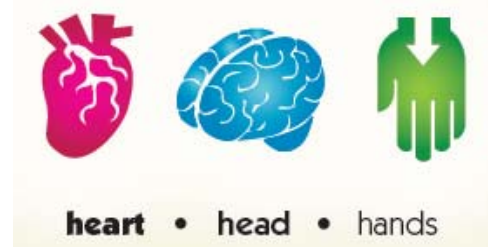


Another exciting year for CONVO!

Upgrade to Energy-Efficient Lighting

•Compact fluorescent lamps (CFLs) may cost more than incandescent bulbs, but they save as much as 80 percent of the energy used by incandescents and last up to 10 times longer.

•While incandescents are recyclable, finding a recycling location is difficult because there isn't much value in the parts. Several states and retailers offer CFL recycling because they contain mercury.

•Light-emitting diode (LED) lamps are even more energy-efficient than CFLs and don't contain mercury; however, they cost much more.

MY wife's brother gave me the gift of a fishing trip on Lake Erie. I hadn't been fishing since I was a youth. Lake Erie was calm that day. Except for a gentle rocking, the boat seemed motionless. I was content to lean against the rail and drink soft drinks while I cast and re-cast my line without much action. But several times I heard the captain of the charter boat say as he started up the engines, "Going to move back. We were in the drift." I had not sensed that we were moving at all, but apparently we were.

In a spiritual sense, none of us is sitting still. We are all moving - moving into tomorrow and the next day and the day after that. Do we have a plan, a purpose, a destination? Are we moving toward God or away from God? Or perhaps we are "in the drift," moved by external forces without any guidance or goal.
